Write a Haiku

A traditional Japanese haiku is a poem with 17 syllables arranged with 5 syllables in the first and third lines and 7 syllables in the 2nd or middle line. Modern, Western haiku don't necessarily keep to these rules, but for the purposes of this quiz, we'll stick to the 5-7-5 syllable arrangement.

Your mission, should you choose to accept it, is to create a 5-7-5 syllable haiku that clearly refers to Clackmannanshire or the county you live in. For example it could mention the Mill Glen or Stirling Castle, but not simply that your county is rainy or there are hills. (This is to make it difficult for you to copy a pretty haiku from the internet – as if you would!!)

Five points will be given for writing 17 syllables, and five points for a 5-7-5 pattern. 5 points given for a reference to something distinct to your county of residence. It could be a place, organisation, person etc. 1-5 points given for wow factor! The haiku can be beautiful, funny, surprising – whatever appeals to you. Maximum 20 points.

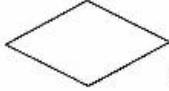

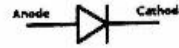
